Healthy Oceans, Healthy Humans is a program at the Center for Health and the Global Environment that aims to create educational materials to inform the general public of their human health connections to the ocean environment. This is a collaborative program, working closely with [advisors](#) and [partners](#) across the nation.

The project highlights the fact that marine ecosystems are essential for human health and focuses on three aspects: Potential medical applications (**Oceans Heal**), seafood (**Oceans Nourish**), and the ocean's role in providing a liveable atmosphere (**Oceans Protect**). It explores global warming and other issues that threaten these life support services, and explores solutions that urge participants to conserve the ocean environment in order to safeguard their own health.
